6 November 2020

Type of Disaster: SUPER TYPHOON ROLLY / GONI

HIGHLIGHTS

- STY ROLLY/GONI barreled through Albay province and surrounding areas on 1 November 2020, with torrential rains and maximum sustained winds of 225 km/h near the center and gustiness of up to 310 km/h. Its first landfall was over San Miguel Island, Tabaco City, at 6:10 AM and second landfall over Tiwi, Albay, at 7:20 AM.
- The devastation was catastrophic: most houses and buildings along the typhoon path sustained damages; floodwaters inundated cities and towns; lahar overflowed rivers and buried whole sections of houses in at least three barangays in Guinobatan and one in Camalig; power and communication lines were down; several churches have sustained major damage; as of November 2, 10 casualties were recorded.
- **There are still 16,271 individuals in evacuation centers in Tabaco City (8,932), Jovellar (2,593), Tiwi (1,342), Malilipot (1,225), Guinobatan (950), Camalig (711), Daraga (205), Ligao City (163), and Libon (150).**
- **Partial report on damaged houses sums up to 73,057 partially damaged and 18,226 totally damaged. Top five LGUs in with totally damaged houses are Tabaco City (6,520), Malinao (3,306), Tiwi (2,217), Polangui (1,582), and Oas (1,410).**
- **Identified needs are shelter assistance; food, water, and non-food items (COVID-19 hygiene kits, water containers, kitchen utensils, blankets, mats, mosquito nets).**

A. CONTEXT

On 1 November 2020, Super typhoon Rolly (International Name: Goni) barreled through the Bicol Region with maximum sustained winds of up to 225 kph near the center and gustiness of up to 310 kph. The eye of the typhoon made first landfall over San Miguel Island, Tabaco City, at 6:10 AM, and its second landfall over Tiwi, Albay, at 7:20 AM. The devastation was catastrophic: most houses and buildings along the typhoon path sustained damages; floodwaters inundated cities and towns; lahar overflowed rivers and buried whole sections of houses in barangays San Francisco, Travesia, and Poblacion in Guinobatan, and Ilawod in Camalig; power and communication lines were down; the roof of the heritage church in Tabaco City was totally damaged, other churches sustained damage as well. As of November 4, 12 casualties were recorded in the province by APSEMO-PDRMC from Malinao (4), Daraga (1), Guinobatan (5), Polangui (1), and (1) Tabaco City. Not yet included in this report are the lifeless body of a 50-year-old male found in the river in Brgy. Tagas, Daraga, and another lifeless body of a 30-something male found near Pili Port, Bacacay.

WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE (WASH). Tiwi has water supply but needs to be tested for safety and potability after the typhoon. Malinao, Guinobatan, Oas, Polangui, Libon, and upland barangays in Tabaco City, have no potable tap water supply due to damaged pipelines. Deployment of mobile water purification vehicles and jerry can water containers in these areas is recommended. Otherwise mass supply of bottled water may also produce unwanted plastic waste. Several classrooms at Marcial O. Rañola Memorial National High School in Guinobatan have non-functioning comfort rooms. OD cases observed in this school. Most schools currently used as evacuation centers lack comfort rooms relative to number of evacuees.

FOOD. Families whose houses were totally damaged, especially those staying in evacuation centers, need food relief after LGU and DSWD supply has run out. Food relief, water, hygiene and used clothing, from local communities have been pouring in mainly into the 2 evacuation centers in Guinobatan.

HEALTH. Weakening of observance of COVID-19 safety protocols have been noted in evacuation centers and communities. COVID-19 hygiene kits will be needed. Provincial Health Office is on the lookout for the following diseases: food and waterborne, respiratory and febrile, leptospirosis, tetanus, measles, and others.

SHELTER AND NFI. Widespread damage in houses is observed in all cities and municipalities affected by the super typhoon. Shelter materials assistance (preferably including GI sheets) will be crucial for bouncing back faster of households. Several communities in Guinobatan and Camalig that have been buried in lahar and silt need relocation.

LIVELIHOOD. Partial report of damage to agriculture is Php 693,207,135.00; damage to fisheries is Php 31,449,760.00; damage to livestock is Php 7,556,310.00. Most farmlands in Albay were inundated with floodwaters. Flooding has not yet subsided in low-lying areas and farmlands in Polangui, Libon, Oas, Guinobatan, Jovellar, Camalig, Malinao, and Tabaco City. 50% of fishing boats in San Miguel Island were reportedly destroyed. Prolonged period of power blackout will lead to loss of livelihood especially in the First and Third Districts of Albay.

B. PARTNERSHIPS AND COORDINATION

- Provincial Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (PDRRMC), as well as several C/MDRRMCs held a zoom meeting on 29 October 2020 to prepare for STY ROLLY. Albay Public Safety Emergency and Management Office (APSEMO) provides updated evacuation report, but post-typhoon reports from C/MDRRMCs are slow to come in.
- SAC Legazpi coordinates with APSEMO, concerned LGUs, and parishes with affected population, and had initial meeting with representatives of UN-OCHA, WFP, IOM, and World Vision to establish coordination and partnership for humanitarian aid.
- SAC Legazpi has conducted a webinar on Organizing and Strengthening Parish Disaster Response Committees (PaDReCom) on 29 October 2020, and Rapid Field Assessments in Malilipot, Tabaco City, Malinao, Tiwi, Polangui, Libon, Oas, Ligao City, and Guinobatan, on 2 November 2020. Second rapid Field Assessment in the Third District of Albay was done on 4 November 2020; Third RFA in Tabaco City on 5 November 2020.

C. DONOR UPDATE

- Most parishes in the diocese provided shelter and soup kitchens to evacuees during the typhoon. Prior to the typhoon, Bishop Joel Baylon instructed parishes to open up their facilities to evacuees.
- Many small local and national relief giving and fund-raising are being organized. SAC Legazpi positions as a provincial “Relief Hub” to help these small initiatives and match their capacity with different affected communities’ needs. SAC Legazpi facilitates Psychological Association of the Philippines (PAP) – Bicol Chapter’s planned Psychological First Aid sessions with typhoon and lahar survivors in Guinobatan.
- Food relief as of today: 1,368 food packs from Diocese of Sorsogon to San Vicente and San Antonio Parishes in Tabaco City, and Batang Mission Area in Ligao City; 420 food packs from Albay Cathedral Parish to Matacon Parish in Brgy Santa Cruz, Libon; 8 sacks of rice for Holy Cross Children’s Home; 3,620 food packs from BDO Foundation via BCDI to Diocese of Virac; 1,000 food packs from Pharmaceutical and Healthcare Association of the Philippines (PHAP) to Rapu-Rapu Parish.

D. LOGISTICS / SECURITY

- Main highways in Albay are already passable. Basud Bridge and Sta. Misericordia Bridge in Sto. Domingo sustained some damage to their structural integrity, thus only one-way traffic is allowed. Toppled

electricity poles all over the province hamper transportation but slowly getting cleared by NEA and PHILRECA-organized electric cooperatives.

- Electricity has not been restored in all parts of Albay province. Cellphone communication is down in most of the First District of Albay, and has slightly improved in the Third District.

E. STAFFING

- SAC Legazpi activated its Emergency Office Protocol for **AYUDA ALBAY 2020: OPERATION STY ROLLY**, with distinct response structures and procedures, and specific staff roles and responsibilities.
- Parishes in affected areas are setting up Parish Disaster Response Committee (PaDReCom) Operation Centers which boost the capacity for data gathering and relief efforts.
